STUDENT SCHOOL RULES

At Western Grammar School, our mission is to promote and develop a safe and supportive environment where everyone understands, values and respects rules. The safety, protection and wellbeing of all students is of fundamental importance to the School. Western Grammar School is committed to child safety and child safety is a shared responsibility at all levels of the organisation.

Below are a set of rules for WGS students to abide by to keep them safe and to nurture a school environment that is conducive to learning and promotes student well-being and growth.

1. BE SAFE:

- No "play " fighting.
- Keep your hands and your feet to yourself. No fighting, biting, hitting, pushing or kicking.
- No bullying and no harassment. This includes no cyberbullying.
- Do not throw dangerous objects (sticks, stones, etc).
- No tackling in sport.
- Use all equipment safely.
- The car park and marked areas are out of bounds, unless supervised by a teacher.
- Do not climb trees or swing on poles.
- Do not climb on roofs.
- Wear the Western Grammar School hat when outside.
- Classrooms are out of bounds during Recess and Lunch, unless supervised by a teacher.
- No weapons are allowed at school. Do not use anything as a weapon.
- Do not tamper with the fire safety equipment.
- No smoking and no illegal drug use.
- Do not leave wallets or valuables in your school bag. Ask your teacher to hold them for you.
- Inform staff members of misconduct, safety hazards and vandalism.

2. BE KIND:

- Speak politely to teachers and students.
- Play fairly with other students. Remember sportsmanship at all times.
- Do not intimidate other students.
- Look out for other students and ask for assistance from a staff member if a student is hurt or upset.

3. BE RESPECTFUL:

- Greet staff members, students and visitors at our school. Offer assistance if they need it.
- Follow the teacher's instructions and classroom rules in a respectful manner.
- Do not interrupt or distract other students while they are learning.
- Do not interrupt or disrupt the teachers while they are teaching.
- Move quickly and quietly with the teachers and students to the classroom.
- Respect differences among people.
- Respect school property and the property of others. Only use their equipment when they give you permission.

- Line up outside the classroom before the lesson.
- Enter and exit the classroom in an orderly manner.
- Stay in your seat unless instructed otherwise by your teacher.
- Raise your hand and wait for permission before speaking.
- Avoid inappropriate mixing or interaction with the opposite gender.
- Avoid behaviour which may contradict the Islamic ethos of the school.
- Avoid behaviour, in or out of school, that may bring the reputation of the school into disrepute or potentially or actually brings discredit to the school.

4. BE CLEAN:

- Brush your teeth and tongue before coming to school.
- Keep your nails short and clean.
- Shower or bath daily.
- Brush your hair and see that it is free of lice.
- If you have nits and lice, please stay at home until your hair is cleared from these pests.
- Boys must keep their hair neat and tidy, not dye it and must not cut their hair displaying levels or spikes.
- See that your school uniform is clean when coming to school in the morning.
- Do not graffiti on school property.
- Care for the environment. Keep your school clean. Do not litter. Place all rubbish in the garbage bins.
- Do not chew gum.

5. BE PROUD:

- Be proud of yourself, your school and the environment
- Wear your school uniform with pride. Do not wear jewellery (except watches). Do not wear make-up.
- Always wear your full school uniform at school, except for special days, which you have been told about.
- When dress other than the school uniform is specified, it must comply with the Islamic dress code.
- Be punctual at school, and for the various lesson or event times.
- Work hard and strive for excellence.

6. BE RESPONSIBLE:

- Use school equipment and facilities responsibly and do not damage or vandalize school property.
- Do not use mobile phones during school hours. Leave mobile phones and other electronic devices at home or in the school office.
- Use toilets facilities responsibly. Do not be wasteful of water and toilet paper; and do not act inappropriately in the toilet areas.
- Use the school internet responsibly, under the supervision of a teacher and do not abuse this privilege under any circumstance.
- Do not damage or vandalise the school furniture, school grounds and building.
