

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

## **ANTI-BULLYING WEEK**

## Bullying. No Way! Take action every day

Western Grammar School participated in a number of events as part of its Anti-Bullying Week campaign from 11th- 15th March 2019.

Definition:

- 1. Misuse of power
- 2. Ongoing and repeated
- 3. Behaviours that can cause harm

Types of Bullying:

- 1. Verbal: Name calling, insulting, teasing etc.
- 2. Physical: Hitting, shoving, intimidating etc.
- 3. Social: Excluding, gossiping, isolating etc

At WGS, students were shown videos by the NSW government informing them of the different types of bullying and behaviors that can cause great harm. During sport lessons, students were advised to co-operate with their coach, teammates and opponents and treat all players equally. Verbal abuse of officials or other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent is not permitted in any sport.

Students were given short reminders in morning assemblies. They learnt about the Islamic implications on bullying, how to help victims and the bully by using different methods of stopping oppression.

Special assemblies were held at WGS for 'National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence.' Students' short stories and spoken word poems were presented. Merit awards were also handed out to the best and fairest sport, as well as drawing and poem competitions. The poem titled "Dear Bully", which was presented by a Year 9 student, was extremely powerful in the message it conveyed.

We also had Shakaya Rashidi, a Year 8 student at WGS, talk about her Aboriginal ancestry.


She spoke about the stolen generation and provided details of the experience of her particular
