# Writing a book in a day







#### PRNCPAL'S MESSAGE



Assalaamu-alaykum warahmatullaahi wabarakaatuh

As term 2 approaches the end, students can look forward to a well-deserved break. Parents can assist their children by ensuring that they spend their holiday time in a balanced and productive way with spiritual, social, recreational and academic activities. In particular, the use of devices at home should be carefully regulated so that students do not spend an excessive amount of time in front of screens. We encourage you to install the Family Zone app provided by the school if you have not yet done so. This app will help you regulate their use of the internet.

We would like to once again advise parents not to give their children internet-accessible phones until they have graduated from school. Current research clearly demonstrates that these devices are having a negative impact on school-aged children.

Two main events that took place towards the end of term 2 included dental care and feed the homeless. Almost fifty students had their teeth checked and cleaned. They were also advised of the importance of good dental hygiene - brushing teeth at least twice a day is essential – after breakfast in the morning and before going to bed at night. Spend at least 2 minutes brushing, ensuring that all areas are cleaned – teeth, gums, tongue and palate.

With the Feed the Homeless project, students and staff donated food and hygiene items which were placed into 54 care packs. The care packs in conjunction with the charity Brothers in Need were taken by year 11 and 12 students to Martin Place in the city on Saturday 29th June and distributed to the homeless. Five teachers accompanied the students on the eye-opening excursion which highlighted the need to be grateful and to show empathy for those less fortunate. We take this opportunity to thank parents for their generous support of the school's charity initiatives. May Allah (swt) reward you abundantly and bless your families.
