The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be taking the NAPLAN writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy exams online between the 10th and 20th of May 2022.

Western Grammar School will also be running practice tests to assist in preparing our students for their examinations. These practice tests are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked, but will provide students with valuable practice.


