


## YEAR 6

Our mindset determines a lot about us and what we achieve. There are two types of mindsets: fixed mindset and a growth mindset. Students with a "fixed mindset" believe that our character, intelligence, and creative ability are set in stone, and we can't change them in any meaningful way. They further believe that good marks are a result of natural intelligence, and on the converse, believe that poor marks in exams are evidence of failure and a lack of intelligence, and feel shame over poor marks. Students with a "growth mindset," on the other hand, thrive on challenge and see failure not as evidence of unintelligence, but as evidence of not having tried hard enough.

It is crucially important that we advocate a growth mindset in our children. Alhumdulillah, Allah in His great wisdom has given us brains which continuously learn new skills and concepts throughout our lives. We can improve ourselves – this is fact. As such, we need to adopt this mindset, and continuously encourage our children to do so as well. When our children do get good marks, we must be careful and never attribute the good marks to them being smart – always link good marks to hard work. And when our children don't do so well, in any aspect of life, we should always attribute this to a lack of hard work – not just hard work on the night before the exam, but hard work on a daily basis!

SCIENCE STUDIES


Alhamdulillah it was a productive end for Term 2, 2017. Students showed great interest and perseverance towards Science and most students excelled this term as reflected in their assessment.

Year 10 students have been learning about precipitation reactions with Ms Yasmin and a lab experiment helped solidify their concepts. This experiment involved a range of chemical reactions that the students had learnt about in class. In a precipitation reaction, two solutions of soluble salts are mixed, resulting in an insoluble solid (precipitate) forming. The results were impressive and the students were excited to learn more. and requires consistent learning and understanding. Any difficulties that students face while learning it could be as a result of their inability to comprehend the skills, knowledge and understanding behind simple concepts and the connection to everyday living. Revising the basics regularly and revisiting topics often will help create a stable foundation for further improvement.

Science teachers will continue to support and guide our students to be the best they can be. We pray Allah SWT will bless them with every success, now and in the future, Insha'Allah.

# NAPLAN 2017

Earlier this term, students sat for their three days of National Assessment Program, Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests that were given to students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across Australia.

These tests are an assessment undertaken to gain a better understanding of student educational abilities in the areas of Spelling and Grammar, Writing, Reading and Numeracy. This year's tests began with the Language Conventions paper which assessed students' spelling and grammar skills, along with their understanding of punctuation.

The second test undertaken was a persuasive writing piece that saw the students planning, writing and editing their own personal persuasion piece under timed conditions. Next, the students sat for the Reading test, which was followed up by the Numeracy test.

It is important to be aware that NAPLAN testing is meant to analyse a student's progress over the years. Additionally, these papers give an insight into student performance on the day of the test only. Classroom teachers perform many assessments of students over the year and have a more detailed understanding of student performance and ability- which is reflected in their gradings and comments on both mid and end of year reports. The results of NAPLAN testing will not be available until later in the year and parents will be notified of these results. **-Ms. Asad**
